We, the Chairmen of the House Health & Human Services Committee, are writing to request that the Department withdraw their submission of final-omitted regulation #14-517, Revisions to the Special Allowances for Supportive Services Requirements.

We understand the Department has already made changes that address deficiencies found in an audit of the special allowances program's verification and issuance process and, that the newly implemented requirements for documentation of need and proof of receipt of services eliminate or mitigate the potential for fraud and abuse and are consistent with existing regulations.

We believe the Department and the citizens of the Commonwealth will greatly benefit from an open review of these changes and that, because they have already been implemented, resubmitting them as proposed will not delay implementation.

The special allowances are essential to families' efforts to find work during this jobless recovery from the deepest recession we have experienced since the Great Depression; and they are also essential to the Department's effort to meet the federal TANF work participation rates. A complete and thorough review with informed public comment will assure that the regulation does not erect unnecessary barriers to work.

We do not argue whether or not the Department has the statutory authority to proceed without public comment but do ask that you see the wisdom in voluntarily agreeing to withdraw the final-omitted form in favor of the process which allows for consideration of the substantial and substantive objections of your stakeholders.

We look forward to your response.
