They have eye infections, ear infections, matted fur, overgrown nails, and a whole host of other issues - all of which are extremely preventable.

It is a sin that in such a highly advanced nation like ours, we still allow our animals, those without a voice and who rely on us to take care of them, to live in these filthy conditions with the basic necessities not even met. We should be ashamed of ourselves that we've abandoned this portion of the dog population and looked the other way while hundreds and thousands of them slowly perished mentally and physically. I have worked with so many cases of breeding females coming out of mills and if any of you have ever done so you would not hesitate to pass these basic regulations, which should have been on the books and enforced decades ago.
