Dear Board:

Please do NOT proceed with your proposed rulemaking regarding outdoor wood-fire boilers. I believe this would be unacceptable for our Commonwealth for the following reasons:

- 1. Wood is a renewable fuel that has been safety used since the beginning of recorded history.
- 2 Wood does not harm the environment. Fossil fuels DO harm the environment. Wood does not add greenhouse gases to the environment- Fossil fuels DO.
- 3. The proposed regulation was prepared using grossly flawed data.
- 4. This regulation will damage the economy of Pennsylvania by killing jobs, and by increasing the heating cost of many homeowners by over 400 percent.
- 5. The Commonwealth consists primarily of heavy-wooded rual areas. It makes no sense to burden the citizens of our entire populated areas that constitute a tiny portion of the Commonwealth.
