I am writing with my concern for a particular provision regarding the proposed regulation of Outdoor Wood Boilers, 39 Pa. B. 6068. Specifically, I would like you to Anomy reconsider the provision requiring a stack height greater than 2 feet above the roof line for ANY residence within 150 ft. I live out in the country and my nearest neighbor is at least a ¼ mile away. In order for me to meet this requirement I would need to install a stack at least 30 feet tall, which is an onerous requirement. I am sure that these rules were prompted by some nitwit putting a boiler in a subdivision and thus causing a great deal of distress to his neighbors. However, I do think that an exception should be made for those of us who don't have any neighbors. Therefore, I would like to recommend that this provision not apply to the residence that is being heated by the boiler in question. Thank you.
