

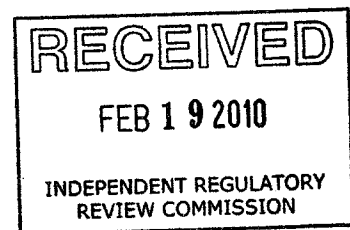
To the Environmental Quality Board:
