In my situation I bought a outdoor boiler on line, the best money could buy in 2004. It is a pressurized unit with a blower. My total cost is around \$9,000. It is not rated for any phase. My storage is double my need so my wood is always well seasoned. I checked with all my adjoining neighbors and they are not bothered by my stove. If I must comply with the new regulations because of the slope my land is on I will need at least a 50 ft high stack. This will greatly increase the draft and cause more wood consumption. It will be an eyesore. My stove also is designed to burn coal. I did not see that fuel listed. Is there something wrong with coal? It burns hot and clean and is almost odorless. My stove has a limited 20 year warranty and will probably last a lifetime. Am I supposed to then dump it in a land fill if can't sell it?
