Below is an e-mail version of a handwritten letter I am mailing to the Environmental Quality Board at P.O. Box 8477 in Harrisburg, PA 17105. I thought you may like to read the points. Similar letters must be received by January 4th to have effect.

Please don't micromanage our state by putting restrictions on wood-fired boilers. They are not popular among the millions who live in the cities, and the few who use them are not destroying our forests or air quality.
