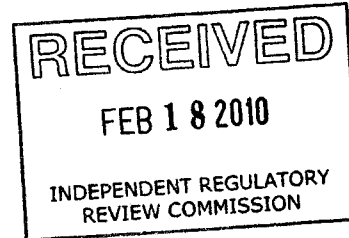

**WHEREAS**, no regulations currently exist in Lower Providence Township regarding outdoor wood-fired boilers,

**NOW, RESOLVED and ADOPTED** this 4<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2010, that the Board of Supervisors of Lower Providence Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania hereby authorizes Emergency Management Coordinator/Fire Marshal Charles A. Mr. DeFrancesco is further authorized to work with Code Enforcement Manager Thomas Heisner to draft an ordinance regarding use of outdoor wood-fired boilers in the Township.

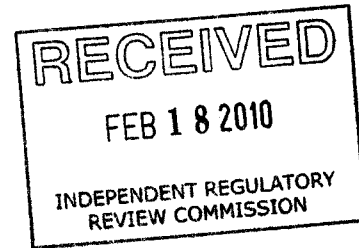
