Dear Independent Regulatory Review Commission:

First, I would like to recognize the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for setting a reasonable ceiling for TDS relating to existing industries with discharge permits. DEP has engaged in a thorough and well rounded stakeholder process to arrive at these standards. I applaud the Department for being careful and conscientious of our state's interests and needs for the opportunity that natural gas drilling presents to us.

Secondly, I would like to urge strong consideration of a discharge standard, 500 milligrams per liter (mg/L) for Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) and 250 mg/L each for Sulfates and Chloride for natural gas drillers. These standards will go a long way towards ensuring that federal drinking water standards are met across the state for TDS.

I acknowledge that many other states that host Hydrofracking do not permit any discharge of wastewater in their states. Pennsylvania is a water rich state; however it does not have the sort of geology that makes large scale deep-well injection an option. Hydrofracking has never been conducted on such a scale and with such volumes of water in our state before. Therefore, it is critical that we implement a strong discharge standard for wastewater that does make it into our water supply.

Please approve these rules so that they may be promulgated quickly and begin protecting the citizens of Pennsylvania as well as the aquatic life that so many of them enjoy.
