

The regulation increases the biennial renewal fee for licensed practical nurses (LPNs), professional nurses (RNs), certified registered nurse practitioners (CRNPs), and licensed dietitian-nutritionists (LDNs). The new fees are necessary to cover the costs of sustaining the Board's operations.

Yes. The Board is required by section 11.2(b) of the Professional Nursing Law (63 P.S. §221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. §667.5(b)) to set fees to raise sufficient revenue to meet expenditures. It is anticipated that without raising fees the Board will realize a significant deficit.

Nonregulation would adversely impact the fiscal integrity of the Board.

Licensees will pay higher biennial renewal fees. There are 53,635 LPNs, 206,565 RNs, 3,072 LDNs and 6,481 CRNPs that will pay increased renewal fees.

Licensees will be required to comply with the regulation. The Board licenses 206,565 RNs; 53,635 LPNs; 6,481 CRNPs; and 3,072 LDNs.

Upon implementation, the increased biennial cost will be as follows:

LPNs $53,635 \times \$20 \text{ increase} = \$1,072,700$

RNs $206,565 \times $20 \text{ increase} = $4,131,300$

LDNs $3,072 \times 20 \text{ increase} = \$61,440$

CRNPs $6,481 \times $25 \text{ increase} = $162,025$

Total increase per biennium = \$5,427,465

Annual costs are based on one-half the RN population renewing annually. CRNPs renew at the same time as the CRNP's RN license is renewed. LPNs and LDNs renew in even-numbered years.

Local governments will not be affected by the regulation.

The amendments to the existing regulations are mandated by section 11.2 of the Professional Nursing Law (63 P.S. §221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. §667.5).

The reconciliation of its budget is an administrative function for which public input is not required. However, the Board receives its budget reports and discusses fee increases in public sessions.

The Board based its fee increase on the recommendations from the BFO. The Board concludes that its proposal is the least burdensome acceptable alternative.

No federal standards apply.

(25) How does this regulation compare with those of other states? How will this affect Pennsylvania's ability to compete with other states?

The Board's biennial renewal fees compare favorably with those in surrounding states. Local LPN fees range from a low of \$65 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$120 per biennial period in New Jersey. Intermediate biennial fees for LPNs are as follows: Maryland \$110, Delaware \$97, West Virginia \$100.

Local RN fees range from a low of \$65 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$142 per biennial period in Maryland. Intermediate biennial fees for RNs are as follows: Delaware \$97, New Jersey \$120, West Virginia \$70.

Local CRNP fees range from a low of \$30 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$160 per biennial period in New Jersey. Intermediate biennial fees for CRNPs are as follows: Maryland \$152, Delaware \$97, West Virginia \$70.

The increases for LDNs compare favorably to those in surrounding states. In New York, LDNs pay \$155 triennially and in Delaware LDNs pay \$192 biennially.

The Board does not believe that the increases will affect Pennsylvania's ability to compete with other states to attract nurses and LDNs.

BIENNIAL RENEWAL FEES

The State Board of Nursing (Board) amends §§ 21.5, 21.147, 21.253 and 21.705, to read as set forth in Annex A. The amendments provide for a new biennial renewal fee for licensed practical nurses (LPNs), professional nurses (RNs), Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners (CRNPs) and Licensed Dietitian-Nutritionists (LDNs).

Effective Date

The amendments will be effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

Section 11.2 of the Professional Nursing Law (RN act) (63 P.S. § 221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. § 667.5) require the Board to set fees sufficient to meet expenditures.

Response to Comments

The proposed rulemaking was published on December 19, 2009. The Board received comments from the Pennsylvania Association of Nurse Anesthetists (PANA), the Pennsylvania Health Care Association (PHCA), Judith Giannuzzi, R.N., the House Professional Licensure Committee (HPLC) and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC). PANA wrote that it had no objection to the proposed rulemaking. PHCA, an organization representing approximately 324 long term care and senior service providers, wrote in opposition to the proposed increase in biennial renewal fees. PHCA opined that the increase could create an impediment for individuals seeking to become and to work as nurses. Ms. Giannuzzi objected to the proposed increase and asked what obligations the Board could not meet without the increase, and whether other cost-cutting options had been explored.

HPLC submitted three comments. First, HPLC requested the rationale for the proposed 45% - 50% increase after 9 years of no increases and after having been notified of the need for increases in the fall of 2008. Second, HPLC recommended a duplicate listing of the fee for examination and licensure be stricken. Third, the Committee recommended that website references be checked and questioned the wisdom of placing website addresses in a regulation. IRRC echoed the HPLC's second comment, recommended that the website link be corrected but remain in the regulation, and requested that the Board submit a "fee report form" for the increases in the final-form regulation.

In determining that a fee increase was necessary, the Board considered both its operational expenses and the ability of its licensees to pay the increased fees. The majority of

the Board's expenses arise from the investigation and prosecution of individuals who have violated the nursing practice acts. Individuals who violate the practice acts place patients at risk. The Board's obligation to protect the public would be compromised if it did not have the funds necessary to investigate and prosecute violations of the practice acts. The Department of State and the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs have explored and implemented various cost-cutting measures over the past several years.

HPLC requested the rationale for the amount of the increase after 9 years of no increases and after having been notified of the need for an increase in the fall of 2008. The Board last increased biennial renewal fees in November 2000. The Board anticipates that the first implementation of the new fee will be in the April 2011.

The Board is statutorily required to monitor revenues and expenditures and to increase fees when it appears that the Board's revenues will not meet its expenditures over a 2-year period. After monitoring revenues and expenses on a biennial basis, the Department's Bureau of Finance and Operations informed the Board, in the late fall of 2008, that the Board's revenues were not projected to meet its expenses over a 2-year period. The Board began drafting its proposed rulemaking and submitted a draft for an incremental fee increase over the coming 10-year period for internal review in January 2009. The incremental increase was an approach that had been suggested by HPLC in its review of other board's biennial renewal fee regulations, but that had not previously been adopted by any other board.

Ongoing discussions ensued between the Board's regulatory officers and the Bureau of Finance and Operations regarding the uncertainty surrounding the approval of an incremental fee increase and the urgency of the Board's need to balance its budget. The Board decided to propose a traditional, one-time increase. The proposal was published in December 2009. In accordance with the Regulatory Review Act, comment periods were provided for the public, the Committees and the Commission. The Board considered the comments at its next meeting on April 13, 2010, and on that same date finalized a draft of the final rulemaking package.

In determining the proposed biennial fee increases, the Board also reviewed nursing salary data compiled by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry. This data shows the average Pennsylvania salary for an LPN is \$39,920, for an RN \$61,390 and for an LDN \$44,420. Data from the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) showed a median salary for CRNPS in 2007 was \$82,590. The increases proposed by the Board would increase the licensure fees for LDNs, LPNs and RNs by \$10 per year, to \$32.50 per year. The increase proposed by the Board would increase the licensure fee for CRNPs by \$12.50 per year, to \$37.50 per year. These fees are significantly lower than the nurse licensure fees charged in most of the surrounding states. The Board does not anticipate that the increases will place an undue burden on licensees or on employers who pay the fees for their employees.

Regarding the web addresses in regulations, licensing boards within the Bureau began including web addresses in regulations at the suggestion of IRRC. Although the Board questioned, as does HPLC, the advisability of putting web addresses, which are subject to change, in regulations, the Board agreed with IRRC that its regulations should provide as much

information as possible to licensees. The Legislative Reference Bureau has agreed to publish corrections to web addresses without requiring the Board to promulgate a rulemaking to effectuate a change. On balance, therefore, it appears that the benefit to including web and email addresses outweighs the possible negative effects when these addresses are changed. The Board has corrected the web addresses for the Commission on Dietetic Registration and the Certification Board for Nutrition Specialists in the final rulemaking.

The Board has deleted the repetitious provision in the fee schedule for registered nurses and has provided the fee report forms as requested by IRRC.

Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

The amendments will have a fiscal impact on nurses and licensed dietitian-nutritionists in the Commonwealth in that the amendments increase the biennial licensure renewal fees for these licensees. The amendments will not otherwise have any fiscal impact nor impose additional paperwork on the private sector, the general public and the Commonwealth and its political subdivisions.


Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the effectiveness of its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on December 7, 2009, the Board submitted notice of this proposed rulemaking, published at 39 Pa.B. 7105 (December 19, 2009), to IRRC and the Chairpersons of the House Professional Licensure Committee (HPLC) and the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee (SCP/PLC) for review and comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC, the HPLC and the SCP/PLC were provided with copies of the comments received during the public comment period, as well as other documents when requested. In preparing the final-form rulemaking, the Board has considered all comments from IRRC, the HPLC, the SCP/PLC and the public.

Findings

The State Board of Nursing finds that:

- (1) Public notice of intention to adopt a regulation at 49 Pa. Code, Chapter 21, was given under sections 201 and 202 of the Act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. §§ 1201-1202) and the regulations promulgated under those sections at 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1-7.2.
- (2) A public comment period was provided as required by law and all comments were considered in drafting this final-form rulemaking.
- (3) The amendments made to the final-form rulemaking do not enlarge the original purpose of the proposed rulemaking as published under section 201 of the Act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. § 1201).
- (4) These amendments to the regulations of the State Board of Nursing are necessary and appropriate for the regulation of the practice of professional nurses in the Commonwealth.

Order

The Board therefore ORDERS that:

- (A) The regulations of the State Board of Nursing, 49 Pa. Code, Chapter 21, are amended to read as set forth in Annex A.
- (B) The Board shall submit a copy of Annex A to the Office of the Attorney General and the Office of General Counsel for approval as required by law.
- (C) The Board shall certify this Order and Annex and shall deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.
