The regulation increases the biennial renewal fee for licensed practical nurses (LPNs), professional nurses (RNs), certified registered nurse practitioners (CRNPs), and licensed dietitian-nutritionists (LDNs). The new fees are necessary to cover the costs of sustaining the Board's operations.

Yes. The Board is required by section 11.2(b) of the Professional Nursing Law (63 P.S. §221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. §667.5(b)) to set fees to raise sufficient revenue to meet expenditures. It is anticipated that without raising fees the Board will realize a significant deficit.

Nonregulation would adversely impact the fiscal integrity of the Board.

Nonregulation would adversely impact the fiscal integrity of the Board. Licensees will pay higher biennial renewal fees.

Licensees will be required to comply with the regulation. The Board licenses 206,565 RNs; 53,635 LPNs; 6,481 CRNPs; and 3,072 LDNs.

Upon implementation, the increased biennial cost will be as follows:

LPNs 53,635 x \$60 increase = \$3,218,100.00

RNs $206,565 \times $65 \text{ increase} = $13,426,725.00$

LDNs $3,072 \times 65 \text{ increase} = \$199,680.00$

CRNPs $6,481 \times $75 \text{ increase} = $486,075.00$

Local governments will not be affected by the regulation.

The amendments to the existing regulations are mandated by section 11.2 of the Professional Nursing Law (63 P.S. §221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. §667.5).

The reconciliation of its budget is an administrative function for which public input is not required. However, the Board receives its budget reports and discusses fee increases in public sessions.

The Board based its proposed fee increase on the recommendations from the BFO. The Board concludes that its proposal is the least burdensome acceptable alternative.

No federal standards apply.

(25) How does this regulation compare with those of other states? How will this affect Pennsylvania's ability to compete with other states?

The Board's biennial renewal fees compare favorably with those in surrounding states. Local LPN fees range from a low of \$65 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$120 per biennial period in New Jersey. Intermediate biennial fees for LPNs are as follows: Maryland \$110, Delaware \$97, West Virginia \$100.

Local RN fees range from a low of \$65 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$142 per biennial period in Maryland. Intermediate biennial fees for RNs are as follows: Delaware \$97, New Jersey \$120, West Virginia \$70.

Local CRNP fees range from a low of \$30 per triennial period in New York to a high of \$160 per biennial period in New Jersey. Intermediate biennial fees for CRNPs are as follows: Maryland \$152, Delaware \$97, West Virginia \$70.

The proposed increases for LDNs are very favorable. In New York, LDNs pay \$155 triennially and in Delaware LDNs pay \$192 biennially.

BIENNIAL RENEWAL FEES

The State Board of Nursing (Board) proposes to amend §§ 21.5, 21.147, 21.253 and 21.705, to read as set forth in Annex A. The proposed rulemaking provides for a new biennial renewal fee for licensed practical nurses (LPNs), professional nurses (RNs), Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners (CRNPs) and Licensed Dietitian-Nutritionists (LDNs).

Effective Date

The amendments will become effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

Section 11.2 of the Professional Nursing Law (RN act) (63 P.S. § 221.2) and section 17.5 of the Practical Nurse Law (63 P.S. § 667.5) require the Board to set fees sufficient to meet expenditures.

Background and Purpose

The Board receives an annual report from the Bureau of Finance and Operations of the Department of State (BFO) regarding its income and expenses. The last increase to biennial renewal fees for nurses occurred November 18, 2000, when the fee for LPNs was increased from \$16 to \$40; the fee for RNs was increased from \$21 to \$45; and the fee for CRNPs was increased from \$26 to \$50. 30 Pa. B. 5952. The biennial renewal fees for LDNs was established May 20, 2006. 36 Pa. B. 2396.

In the fall of 2008, BFO advised the Board that it would be required to raise its biennial renewal fees to meet current and projected expenses. On July 27, 2009, BFO again met with the Board and provided an updated recommendation regarding whether a fee increase would be required for the Board to meet its operating expenses, and what fee would be recommended.

BFO reported that the Board would face an inability to meet its obligations if fees were not increased. BFO advised the Board that it would face a deficit of over \$1 million by FY 11-12 if fees are not raised, will face a deficit of over \$3.8 million in FY 12-13, a deficit of over \$6.4 million in FY 13-14, a deficit of over \$10.3 million in FY 14-15, a deficit of over \$14 million in FY 15-16, a deficit of over \$19 million in FY 16-17 and a deficit of over \$22.6 million in FY 17-18. BFO recommended, and the Board adopted, an approximately 45% increase. Pursuant to the increase, the new RN biennial fee will be \$65, the new LPN biennial fee will be \$60, the New CRNP biennial fee will be \$75, and the new LDN biennial fee will be \$65.

Description of Amendments

The Board proposes an approximately 45% increase in the biennial renewal fees for LPNs, RNs, CRNPs, and LDNs. The Board proposes no increase in the biennial renewal fee for CRNP Prescriptive Authority Approval because CRNPs will already be faced with an increase to both the RN and CRNP biennial renewal fees.

Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements.

The amendments will have a fiscal impact on nurses and licensed dietitian-nutritionists in the Commonwealth in that the amendments increase the biennial licensure renewal fees for these licensees. The amendments will not otherwise have any fiscal impact nor impose additional paperwork on the private sector, the general public and the Commonwealth and its political subdivisions.

Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on December 7, 2009, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee (SCP/PLC) and the House Professional Licensure Committee (HPLC). A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days from the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections must specify the regulatory review criteria that have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor of comments, recommendations and objections raised.
