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4 PROCEEDINGS 1 2 3 MS. SHULMAN: I'd like to welcome you all to the 4 5 Environmental Quality Board's public hearing on the proposed regulations concerning volatile organic 6 7 compound emission standards for large appliance and metal furniture surface coating processes. 8 My name is Arleen Shulman. I am program 9 manager of the Department of Environmental 10 Protection's Division of Air Resource Management. 11 Ι 12 am representing the EQB at today's hearing, and I 13 officially call this hearing to order at 1:01 p.m. The purpose of this hearing is to formally accept 14 15 testimony on the proposed regulations concerning Volatile Organic Compound or VOC Emission Standards 16 17 for Large Appliance and Metal Furniture Surface Coating Processes. In addition to this hearing, the 18 19 EQB held a similar hearing on this proposal yesterday, 20 Tuesday, February 16th, in Pittsburgh and will hold 21 another hearing tomorrow, Thursday, February 18th, in Norristown. 22 23 The proposed rulemaking, which was adopted by the EQB on November 17th, 2009, amends 25 24 25 Pa. Code Chapter 129 to limit emissions of volatile

organic compounds from the use and application of 1 2 coatings and cleaning materials in large appliance and 3 metal furniture surface coating processes. Adoption 4 of the VOC emission requirements in the rulemaking is 5 part of the Commonwealth's strategy, in concert with other Ozone Transport Region jurisdictions to further 6 7 reduce the transport of VOC ozone precursors and ground-level ozone throughout the Ozone Transport 8 9 Region and to attain and maintain the eight-hour ozone 10 national ambient air quality standard.

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11 Federal statutory or regulatory limits do not exist for VOC emissions from large appliance and 12 13 metal furniture coating processes; however, the Clean 14 Air Act and its implementing regulations require that 15 State Implementation Plans or SIPs for nonattainment areas must include, quote, reasonably available 16 control measures, and this includes, quote, reasonably 17 available control technology or RACT for sources of 18 19 The Clean Air Act further requires that emissions. for moderate ozone nonattainment areas, states must 20 revise their SIP to include RACT for sources of VOC 21 22 emissions covered by a Control Techniques Guideline or CTG document issued by the EPA prior to the area's 23 24 date of attainment. The Department has reviewed the 25 recommendations including the EPA's 2007 CTG for large

appliance and metal furniture coatings and has 1 determined that the measures are appropriate to be 2 3 implemented in this Commonwealth as RACT in this proposed rulemaking in order to reduce VOC emissions 4 5 from the use and application of coatings and cleaning 6 materials in large appliance and metal furniture 7 surface coating processes. The regulation, when adopted by the board as a final rulemaking will be 8 submitted to the EPA as a revision to the SIP. 9 10 There are four large appliance surface

coating facilities and 16 metal furniture surface 11 12 coating facilities in the Commonwealth that 13 collectively emitted 68.5 tons of VOC in 2008 and may 14 be subject to the limitations included in the proposed 15 rulemaking. It's estimated that the implementation of the recommended control options in this rulemaking 16 17 will reduce VOC emissions in Pennsylvania by 23 times 18 per year.

The Department discussed the rulemaking with the air quality technical advisory committee over the course of several meetings. On May 28th, 2009, the committee concurred with the Department's recommendation to present the proposed amendments to the board for approval as proposed rulemaking. There are no witnesses in the room so unless one shows up
