The movement to have a license for Massage Therapy in the state of Pennsylvania has been an ongoing effort for over twenty years. We are finally close to having a license.

However, something happened in October that makes the legislation a <u>bad</u> thing for massage therapists. Members of the Insurance Industry, and the Physical Therapists Association came to the IRRC meeting and asked to have the word therapeutic struck from the legislation. It was removed, and the scope of practice narrowed down to almost nothing.

They have done this in other states and it has effectively gutted the power of the Massage Therapists in those states.

The Massage Therapists are not able to advertise that their work has any therapeutic benefit. They are reduced to pampering style massage only.

We would like to continue doing Therapeutic Massage. We love to help people get out of pain and heal. We will not be able to use the word Therapeutic with the current regulations.
