The current/final version of this legislation excludes the word therapeutic, and restricts the scope of practice for massage therapists in such a way that it will effectively cripple the industry's ability to relieve pain and help the general population live healthier lives. The changes made at the October meeting of the IRRC are not acceptable. Massage Therapy is by nature, therapeutic.

We would like to continue doing Therapeutic Massage. We love to help people get out of pain and heal. We will not be able to use the word Therapeutic with the current regulations.

Reasoning:

We would like the word "Therapeutic" put back into the definition of Massage Therapy. We would like the "scope of practice" defined as it was in the May proposal. We would like the wording to stay that says, "Massage therapists treat the soft tissue manifestations of the human body, which may include the following:"

Something happened in October that makes the legislation a <u>bad</u> thing for massage therapists. Members of the Insurance Industry, and the Physical Therapists Association came to the IRRC meeting and asked to have the word therapeutic struck from the legislation. It was removed, and the scope of practice narrowed down to almost nothing.
