Re: <u>Proposed Amendments to Chapter 77, Noncoal Mining Fees</u>

## Members:

I am responding to a proposed new fee as printed in PA Bulletin, Doc. No. 10-1584. Both the large and small permits that do not go below water table or contiguous terrain should both be inspected twice yearly. There is no difference in cost to inspect either.

§77.106 Fees: In an attempt to make the industry self-supporting, I would definitely approach the small surface mining fees differently. They are not self-supporting and should also be bonded and subject to the same closure rules as large permits. I suggest the following fees:

## **New Permits:**

| Large Surface Mining (below water table)     | \$20,225.00 |

Small non-coal mining permits are not paying fees sufficient to cover the Departmental costs of administration, inspection, closure, and monitoring.
