In response to the proposed rulemakings, in specific proposed 40.67 (continuing education), I am opposed. We are not all functioning as private practitioners. Many of us are specialized; I am involved in motion analysis in a pediatric orthopaedic setting. With my experience, I am typically the person performing the education. Attending "courses" has been a joke, with my knowledge most often exceeding those providing the education. Proposed 40.68 is ambiguous and confusing. A lot of words sound good, but actual, concrete descriptors of ways to accomplish the proposed 15 CEUs/Year, beyond costly and timely course work, are nowhere to be found.

I view these proposed regulations as excessive and potentially expensive for the typical, hospital-based therapist. While I fully understand the State's desire to provide for the best possible healthcare, this further causes a burden on the ever increasing healthcare costs. Hospital systems are already reducing education expenditures, and the costs the practitioners will have to assume are not being balanced with salary increases. Therefore, I certainly hope the State considers the "practical" ramifications these changes will have on our profession at ALL levels (beyond the narrow scope of private practitioners).
