I am a property owner who earns royalty revenue from conventional oil and gas activity on my land, and I am concerned that the added burden of increased regulation and associated costs could significantly harm the industry while providing little or no added benefit to the environment.

From what I see, Pennsylvania's environment is in good hands with the oil and gas industry. Those who work on my property and others I encounter in this industry live, work and play in the same areas where the oil and gas industry operates, and they all share a passion for protecting the Commonwealth's natural resources. It is obvious that they – like me – want to pass on the legacy of a clean, healthy environment to our children and grandchildren.

I understand that regulations are necessary and must be updated periodically to match current laws and industry best practices. It will also mean less tax revenue for all levels of government, placing even greater burdens on already-stressed government services. Fewer oil and gas wells will also mean less oil and gas supply which will once again increase our dependence on other countries for our energy needs.
