Thank you for your dedication to improve Prosthetists, Orthotists, Pedorthists and Orthotic Fitters industry.

We are proud to say that Foot Comfort Center is one of the leaders of the industry. We see thousands of patients a year and accept most insurance companies in the area. When people have no medical insurance, we help them by extending discounts. Many doctors in the area would attest to our high quality, patient-friendly environment. We would like to use this comment period and contribute to the published rules that will govern the law.

Based on our research of similar legislations of other States, we found that the State of Iowa has incorporated the concept of "Indirect Supervision" into their law.

Indirect supervision would imply that a licensed certified professional would be liable and responsible for any non-licensed Orthotic Fitters. This licensed professional would also be accountable for all training and formal education of non-licensed individuals. In a case when a licensed professional would not be present during the delivery of care, he/she must review and sign all medical records produced by non-licensed professionals. A licensed professional must readily be available for direct consultation within 15 minutes during the patient's visit in case direct supervision in required.

This clarification would make Orthotic Fitter services more readily available to patients, without diminishing quality of care.
