I have been licensed as a DC in PA for twenty years and have attended many seminars, both on line and live in person. What I have experienced is learning and understanding are both more easily accomplished in the online setting compared to "live" seminars due to the simple fact that if one missed what was said one could easily re-play or rewind the "video" as often as needed, or pause to refer to other material which may aid in comprehending. Where as in a "live" setting one may not raise a hand to ask the instructor to repeat what was said due to feeling embarassed or judged by other attendees. Secondly, I have found, and I believe that it has been proven, that learning is better accomplished in smaller shorter "attention span" segments, which is possible with most online courses, rather than four, eight, or even twelve hour marathon segments which are what most "live" seminars seem to be.

In conclusion, I can state from experience that online courses are not only more convenient and more cost effective, they are a better way to learn the presented material. I have left many "live" seminars with the feeling of "thank goodness it's finally over" . I can honestly say I have not felt that way after any online course. So I ask that you not restrict my options as to how I continue to earn the CE credits.
