As a Pennsylvanian homeschooling family of two children who are fully vaccinated, the proposed changes to the school vaccination regulations (28 Pa Code 23.81-23.87) don't directly affect us.

I do, however, have concern about the state mandating that students who are not up-to-date receive all necessary vaccinations in five days' time.

This seems unnecessarily dangerous, and perhaps even impossible.

Please revise this timeline to a more reasonable period of time, such as 60 or 90 days.

A homeschooling family who, in good faith, plans on adhering to the education law (that also crosses over into the realm of public health), should have sufficient time to work with their family doctor or pediatrician to accomplish this.

I know that when I call to schedule an appointment at our pediatrician, I have to schedule considerably far in advance. How many children wouldn't even be able to get in and be seen in five days?
