Why should we pay more just because the state needs more money! I still haven't received my tax return from the state from 2016! This is the only reason the state is initiating this increase. The state has no money!! Why try to get it from the little people! We don't earn enough to cover this debt and the therapists will start dropping off like flies then the state will have NO REVENUE RAISED BY OUR FEES!
