I have recently learned of the ruling in the Sonny v Dallas case and my heart is heavy and my soul infuriated that such a mindless decision is even possible.

As the parent of a special needs autistic child, why would you even consider lowering the standards of skilled practicing BCBA services staff to that of a person with a mere BS degree? Clearly, the ruling judge has no personal experience or took the time to gather greater insight to the impact the lessor experienced practitioner has in dealing with this mental issue within our children.

In response to losing the Sonny O vs. Dallas class action law suit, it is correct to possibly understand your decision that you will scrap BHRS services and replace it with a program that enables untrained persons labeled as 'licensed' by the state to hopefully provide ABA.

Instead of 'best practice' (a BCBA supervising an RBT that works with your child), is this is truly what you are now suggesting?
