The revenue gap that has been created by the current inadequate fee schedule has led to a reduction in staffing for the Air Quality Program, which in turn increases the time it takes to approve plans and to issue operating permits. Without the proper staffing, the Program cannot respond to citizens' complaints in a timely manner, conduct inspections effectively, or enforce environmental law as intended.
