Yeager's Fuel, Inc is located in Allentown, PA and we have been providing residential heating products and services to the greater Lehigh Valley since 1939

- The transition from 500 parts per million sulfur to 15 parts per million ultra-low sulfur heating oil (ULSHO) will reduce soot accumulation which will ultimately keep heating systems cleaner. Cleaner systems result in higher energy efficiency along with reduced service calls. This will help the ultimate consumer save on heating costs.
- Using ULSHO containing less than 15 ppm lowers sulfur oxide emissions in the flue gas by more than 97% compared to heating oil with 500 ppm sulfur, and produces sulfur oxide emissions that are comparable to natural gas heating equipment.
- ULSHO is compatible with existing oil heat equipment. Customers won't need to install a new system to use USLHO.
- Pennsylvania is the only state in the state in the Mid-Atlantic/Northeast Visibility Union (MANE-VU) who has not fully adopted a ULSHO standard. As a petroleum marketer I fully support aligning our state with the rest of the region to achieve improved air quality and cleaner fuel.

The switch to ULSHO is long overdue!
