I am not a scientist but my dad was a chemist and HS chemistry teacher. He also wrote extensively about air and water pollution and published a number of books on the subject. I remember his speaking out forcefully against chlorofluorocarbons and how they were depleting stratospheric ozone, which protects us from harmful ultraviolet radiation.

I understand as a lay person how harmful carbon dioxide and fossil fuel emissions are. I understand that these emissions have been changing our climate and that we have been seeing the results of that change for years: species becoming extinct, catastrophic storms, etc. Pennsylvania (like all the states) has been effected dramatically by this pollution and the effects will only worsen over time if we human beings don't act aggressively.

I urge you (for all of us here now and for your grandchildren and future generations) to put forth strong regulations that would reduce carbon dioxide pollution from power plants within Pennsylvania and establish our participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI).
