I feel as though the proposed fee increases are excessive. A 64% increase by 2025 for a renewing dentist is unacceptable and appears to be an arbitrary number. Does the board have a financial breakdown as to the current deficiencies that the board believes a 64% fee increase over the next 5 years is indicated to make up for those deficiencies. A complete financial report should be provided to support the need for the proposed increases instead of assuming that these arbitrary increases will be okay for a dental community that is already struggling.
