PA CITIZEN COMMENT:

As an Independent Living Resident of Foulkeways at Gwynedd, I strongly oppose the proposed Department of Health Regulations that replace 28 PA Code Chapters 201 and 211.

It is especially important not to move too quickly because we are still dealing with the far-reaching and unknown economic effects of the current COVID-19 pandemic.

Because these regulatory changes will affect the future survival of the care I may or may not require in Foulkeways Nursing Facility (which I moved here to depend upon) I believe any decision of this issue with far-reaching effects or unforeseen consequences should require more thought and an in-person

discussion.

By the way, Foulkeways at Gwynedd's Nursing Facility withdrew from the Medicare program in 2017 because we wanted to allow the nursing home staff time to spend with providing care rather than sitting at a computer documenting for Medicare money. And the staff have been providing that personal care. I was visiting a Friend who had had a knee replacement 3 days earlier and while I was there for 30 minutes, 4 different staff came in to see her – from a social worker to a dietitian, a nurse ,and a person carrying her lunch tray.
