This ensures that mail being sent to the Board by all individuals will be received and reviewed on a daily basis during the week.

The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board), under the general authority in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1202(b)(30) (relating to general and specific powers) and the specific authority in 4 Pa.C.S. § 311, 13A02(1) and (2), 13B02, 13C02, and 3302 (relating to general and specific powers of the Board; regulatory authority; regulatory authority; regulatory authority; and regulatory authority of board) proposes to amend Chapters 403a, 491a, 503a, 815a, 1119a, 1209a to read as set forth in Annex A.

Purpose of the Rulemaking

This Final-Omitted rulemaking removes the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board's Post Office Box from the mailing address for the Board, replacing it with the physical address of the Board's Harrisburg office.

Explanation

Due to issues related to the Post Office Box of the Board being checked at irregular intervals during the COVID-19 public health crisis and other mail related issues, the Board has determined the most appropriate step would be to direct all mail be sent to the Harrisburg office.

This change is being made in six separate chapters. The text being removed is the Board's Post Office Box, and it is being replaced with the Board's physical office address in Harrisburg.

The only other change is modifying the Chapter title of 1119a (relating to self-exclusion) to add the term Video Gaming, to clarify that the provisions only apply to Video Gaming Self-Exclusion, consistent with all other self-exclusion sections in other Subparts of the Board's regulations.

Comment and Response Summary

As this is a Final-Omitted Regulation package, no prior notification or publication was made, and as such, no public comment was received.

Fiscal Impact

Commonwealth. The Board does not expect that the provisions contained in this rulemaking will have a negative fiscal impact on the Board or any other Commonwealth agency.

Political Subdivisions. This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact on political subdivisions of the Commonwealth.

Private Sector. The amendments contained in this rulemaking will provide more flexibility to get new table games and new features of existing table games into licensed facilities quicker, thereby enabling the licensees to be more competitive with operators in surrounding jurisdictions, generating additional revenues.

General Public. This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact on the general public.

Paperwork Requirements

None.

Effective Date

These final-omitted regulations will become effective upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5.1(c) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(c)), on **INSERT DATE HERE** the Board submitted a copy of this Final-Omitted Regulations and a copy of the Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC), to the Chairpersons of the House Gaming Oversight Committee and the Senate Community, Economic and Recreational Development Committee, and to the Attorney General for review.

Findings

The Board finds that compliance with the proposed rulemaking procedures of the Commonwealth Documents Law (45 P.S. § 1201 and 1202) are impracticable and contrary to the public interest, as comments from the public are not appropriate, necessary, or beneficial. The amendments made by the Board to the effected Chapters merely pertain to agency procedure and practice, and are necessary and appropriate for the efficient administration and oversight of gaming activities.

Order

The Board, acting under 4 Pa.C.S. Part II, orders that:

(1) The regulations of the Board, 58 PA.CODE CH. 403a, 491a, 503a, 815a, 1119a, 1209a are amended to read as set forth in Annex A.

(2) The Chairman of the Board will submit this order and Annex A to the Office of Attorney General for approval as to legality as required by law.

(3) The Chairman of the Board shall certify this order and Annex A and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.

(4) This order shall take effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
