Thank you for your October 17, 1997, letter concerning the proposed rulemaking to revise the State Forest Rules and Regulations. I appreciate your taking time to further clarify the issues that I addressed in my letter of October 14, 1997. I wish to comment further on one remaining point with which I strongly disagree and which I urge you to remove from the final rulemaking process, Section 21.61 Camping Permit.

While I understand your concern for those unwise campers who might leave home without notifying their families of their intended whereabouts, the state cannot become everyone's keeper. I find it unreasonable to limit the free access of our state forests because of this limited number of individuals. The issuing of a permit will not stop the phone calls into your district offices when a camper is late in returning from a camping trip.

Your response also alarmed me further when you say in the future the Department may be forced to "control the numbers". God forbid! However, I do appreciate that there are locations, mainly near the larger population centers, where concentrated use could be a future problem, just as it is today in some of our state parks on given holiday weekends. I do not agree that we need such restrictive regulation language today or in the near future. Should the problem occur in the future, could we not utilize your new "800" telephone system to control such areas?

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Before any permit process for our state forest use is ever implemented, I would urge you to provide access to every Pennsylvania citizen via a free telephone system. There should be no inconvenience attached to accessing our state's forests. Given time for the Department to work out the new "800" park reservation process, I am confident that you will be able to design it for state forest access, <u>if and when that becomes necessary.</u>

Again, thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on your efforts. I want you to know that I do appreciate your efforts and those of all who were involved in this updating process.
