Correction to Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Regulations

On March 23, 2001, the Department of Labor and Industry (Department) delivered the Workers' Compensation Health and Safety final-form regulation to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC), the Senate Committee on Labor and Industry and the House Committee on Labor Relations. This regulation was deemed approved by the Senate Committee on Labor and Industry and the House Committee on Labor Relations on April 13, 2001, and was approved by IRRC on April 19, 2001. Thereafter, the regulation, containing an incorrect version of § 129.1602(6), was submitted to the Office of Attorney General (OAG) and was reviewed and approved by the OAG. On June 28, 2001, two copies of the OAG-approved version were submitted to the office of the *Pennsylvania Code and Bulletin (Pa. Bulletin)*. The *Pa. Bulletin* published the OAG-approved text on July 14, 2001.

Under the direction of the Governor's Office of General Counsel, the Department has prepared this Notice to correct language in § 129.1602(6) to reflect the version of § 129.1602(6) previously approved by IRRC and the Senate and House Committees.


The corrected version of the regulation is as follows:

§ 129.1602. Order to show cause/penalties.


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(6) In a proceeding under this section, the Department has the burden to demonstrate, upon a preponderance of the evidence, that the respondent has failed to comply with the act or related regulations.






