I am deeply concerned about the effect the exploration and drilling of the Marcellus Shale in PA may have on the streams, ponds, lakes and rivers as well as the ground water itself.

The entire impact of all the frackwater used in drilling - its origin, use, flowback, transportation, treatment and disposal must be carefully monitored and controlled. Everything possible must be done to assure our waters do not become a dumping ground for frackwater, adversely affecting their health and all the life dependent on them, including humans.

Please do not weaken your proposed discharge standards for Total Dissolved Solids, which should be stated as a daily minimum.

Discharge standards should be set for certain contaminants such as bromides, arsenic, benzene, radium, magnesium and volatile organic compounds.

Please put the regulations in place as soon as possible, and stop issuing drilling permits until the Ch. 95 revisions are in place.
