I am a concerned parent in Pennsylvania who is questioning the changes being made to 28 Pa. Code Chapter 27.

It seems to me that what is being proposed is greatly intruding on our rights as citizens to privacy and our own healthcare choices. Such as my body, my choice. And as a parent, also the choice to make the decisions for my own children, as I (along with their father) am the legal guardian of them; Pennsylvania is not.

I will never agree with any law that does not include exemptions for individuals based on their belief/convictions. We have every right to choose for or against any medical intervention when it comes to our own bodies and those of our children.

I do not agree with any mandatory regulations where any entity is required to provide personal and private medical documents to the state without the consent of the individual.

Nor for parents/guardians to be required to submit a written notice any time they decline a vaccination.
